Joseph: "I really appreciate the fresh vegetables that people grow. I can't afford this kind of fresh produce. I love the onions, and the fresh fruit, and corn. "We retired and were living in our van camper on our son's property. We were kind of homeless. It took four months to start receiving our Social Security and we were living on \$504 a month, and used our savings to move here. We were eating, but not a lot. We came here and started volunteering. We feel special. We get to know the community and have met so many people."

Mrs. *J.: I've never been to the food bank as an adult.* So the first time I went, I felt poor. My idea of the food banks were based on what I'd seen on commercials and movies. I honestly thought they would just give you bread and water like in Jesus' time. But they give you food for days, and that felt good.

Knowing others were there for the very same reasons changed the experience for me. It made the process easier to go through with, although the entire time I felt like running out of there. I had gone through something by the time I reached the back door. I felt changed somehow. What changed was that I had accepted where I was at that point in my life, realizing for the first time it was okay to ask for help."

Roger: I am 61 years of age, and very blessed to be alive. Two years ago I had a stroke which left me with an illness that caused me to lose my job and go into early retirement. Soon to find out that my retirement check was not going to be enough to keep up with my bills, even after cutting back on many things. I just want to say I personally am ever so grateful for the help of the hardworking volunteers at FISH Food Banks. They have helped me and continue to help to be able to make ends meet so much easier. At some time in the near future I plan to hopefully repay back some of that kindness by volunteering myself again. Thank you to everyone involved. You truly are a God's Blessing.
